The Categorical Internal Medicine Residency includes three years of training.

The PGY-1 schedule is the same for Categorical and Preliminary Medicine Residents.

During the in-patient ward rotations, each team of one resident and one intern is on overnight call every fourth night.

During the ICU rotations, interns are on overnight call every fourth night. On weeknights, residents take calls with their interns until 7 p.m. A night float resident takes admissions and helps the intern with cross-coverage until 7a.m. On Saturdays, residents stay with the intern, thus, each ICU resident works two Saturdays a month.

The night float resident works Sunday through Friday. Each night float rotation is two weeks long.

* Family Health Center (FHC) – Ambulatory rotation at the FHC.
